


STEP 1, MAKE AN A CHORD USING FINGERS 2,3,4






UP A FRET

HERE IS A VARIATION ON THE 5TH STRING ROOT MAJOR BARRE CHORD. USE A 3RD FINGER BARRE TO MAKE THE OPEN A SHAPE. 4 YOUR 1ST FINGER DOES NOT BARRE. OMIT AND DO NOT STRUM THE 1ST STRING W THIS VARIATION.
